Cleveland Lodge #4 honorary member **Robert Portenier** passed away on October 2, 2015, at the age of 99.

Twin Ports Lodge #12 member **Richard D. Bibby** (#10258) passed away on December 20, 2015, at the age of 93. He sailed the Great Lakes prior to World War II. During the war he was a merchant mariner for the US Maritime Administration. He was awarded a medal for bravery and service to the citizens of Russia during convoys to Murmansk. Soo Rescue

On September 9, 2015, during a routine Soo Locks Boat Tours trip, Captain **Clayton Hill** and crew were downbound on the Canadian side. As they approached buoy 108, they saw a cap-sized kayak with two persons in the water. Capt. **Hill** contacted the US Coast Guard and found that it would be about 15 minutes until a small boat arrived. Seeing the two persons struggle in the water, he approached them and the crew successfully helped one man aboard the tour boat. The other remained in the water. Hearing the radio traffic, Capt. **Robert Schallip** (ISMA Past Grand President) and his tour boat crew departed their dock and headed to the scene. A Canadian pleasure boat also arrived and was able to get the second person onto the swim platform. Due to the observations and quick work by Captain **Hill** and his crew, as well as Captain **Schallip** and his crew, the two kayakers are alive and well.

Lifesaving Award

On August 14, 2015, the crew of the *Algoway*, captained by Niagara Lodge #20 President **Dino Dini**, spotted and reported a pleasure craft and its occupants in distress in Lake Erie off Lorain, OH. The *Algoway's* workboat was launched with three crew members aboard, along with their trauma kit, defibrillator and oxygen kit. The *Algoway* maneuvered to windward of the stricken craft to provide a lee for the occupants of the pleasure

boat and the *Algoway* crew assisting. With the US Coast Guard arriving on scene, four occupants of the pleasure craft were rescued and the body of a fifth recovered from the water.



On November 25, 2015, the US Coast Guard presented the Captain David P. Dobbins Award to the *Algoway* crew and Capt. **Dini** for their lifesaving efforts.

Industry Newsbriefs –

- On January 19, 2016, the US Coast Guard issued a Marine Safety Alert reminding mariners of the dangers of relying solely on global navigation satellite systems, such as GPS, for navigation and positioning. These systems are subject to natural, accidental, and intentional interference. "Therefore, it is important to remember to use all available means for navigation and maintain proficiency so you can still navigate should your primary GPS fail." - On January 13, 2016, the Ninth Coast Guard District LNM Notification system notified recipients that an updated electronic edition of the Volume 7 Light List is available on the USCG Navigation Center's website at <http://www.navcen.uscg.gov/?pageName=lightLists>. Complete versions of all 2016 Light Lists are updated weekly and can be found at <http://www.navcen.uscg.gov/?pageName=lightListWeeklyUpdates>.
- On January 12, 2016, the St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corporation (SLSMC) announced a toll rate increase of 2% for the 2016 navigation season. It also announced the introduction of a new Gateway Incentive program created to support the System's competitiveness. The new revised tariff can be found at http://www.greatlakes-seaway.com/seaway_handbook/seaway-handbook-en/web_schedule_tolls.pdf.
- The St. Lawrence Seaway's 2015 navigation season closed ice-free on December 31, 2015. 36 million tonnes of cargo transited the waterway during the season, with grain at volumes well above the five-year average. However, the total 36,110,000 tonnes of cargo was down by 9.47% from 2014's total of 39,887,000 tonnes. Vessel transits totaled 3780 in 2015 versus 3927 in 2014. The 2015 season opened

on April 2, about a week later than usual, reflecting frigid conditions in early spring. The 2015 navigation season was 274 days long. Last vessel through the Welland Canal was *Mississagi* on December 31, while *Baie St. Paul* exited the Montreal/Lake Ontario section on December 30.

- On January 15, 2016, the US EPA announced that the governments of Canada and the United States have published a draft Lake Superior Lakewide Action and Management Plan developed by the Lake Superior Partnership that documents ecosystem conditions, threats and proposed priority actions under the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement. The governments are seeking public comments on the draft report until January 29, 2016. The draft report is a product of extensive collaboration among experts in a variety of subject areas and summarizes current knowledge on Lake Superior. - On January 4, 2016, the Conference of Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Governors and Premiers released the region's draft Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Maritime Transportation System Strategy for public comment. Comments will be accepted until February 3. Find the full document at <http://www.cglslgp.org/media/1621/draft-regional-mts-strategy-january-2016.pdf>.
- On January 8, 2016, the National Maritime Center (NMC) issued a reminder that completed physical exams must be submitted to a Regional Exam Center (REC) and should not be sent directly to the NMC. - In December 2015, Environment Canada and NOAA requested that vessels submit freezing spray observations to help with US and Canadian freezing spray forecasts. An online submission form can be found at http://www.opc.ncep.noaa.gov/icing_report.php.
- On December 17, 2015, the US Coast Guard National Maritime Center issued an advisory as follows: "Until further notice, the National Maritime Center (NMC) will continue to accept applications for medical certificates submitted via the US Coast Guard form CG-719K Rev (01-09) with an expiration date of June 30, 2012. Note that this form is not required; it is an alternative to the current version, form CG-719K Rev (01-14) with an expiration date of January 31, 2016." - On December 3, 2015, the US EPA Great Lakes National Program Office announced that the US and Canada Draft Report on Groundwater Science is now available for public comment. "The governments of Canada and the United States have published a draft report that documents groundwater science relevant to the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement. The governments are seeking public comments on the draft report until January 31, 2016. For more information, see http://binational.net/wp-content/uploads/2015/12/gw_2015_summary_en_final.pdf.
